COLLEGE HISTORY BOOK LAUNCH

The historical account of the College from the foundation year of 1954 to 2014 is captured in the two volume set – Making a Difference expertly written by former Principal of the College and avid history buff, Mr Clement Mulcahy. The launch of this book is on Wednesday 21 February at 7:00 pm here at the College. After this date the book will be available for purchase through the Accounts Office for \$119. This limited edition print, 448 page, two volume set is a great record of the College history for those in our College community, past and present.

CODE OF CONDUCT

As part of Catholic Education's ongoing commitment to ensure that our students are kept safe, all Catholic schools in Western Australia promulgated a Code of Conduct on 1 January 2017. This document clearly sets out the legal and contractual obligations placed upon all staff working in Catholic schools with regard to the relationships with students. The key elements of the Code will be highlighted at our parent evenings this term. I encourage you to read the Code of Conduct and discuss it with your children. Any breaches of the Code must be reported to the Principal.

SUPERVISION OF STUDENTS – DUTY OF CARE

I advise parents that we can only provide supervision of students from 8:00 am through to 3:30 pm (*classes commence at 8:25 am and conclude at 3:10 pm*) unless a student is involved in a College sanctioned activity.

ABSENCE FROM SCHOOL

Regular school attendance is very important. Schools are finding that some parents are taking their children out of school for extended periods to take advantage of cheap holidays, usually overseas. I suggest that if you are considering any extended absences from school that you please discuss this with me prior to making bookings. An extended leave of absence form must also be completed and signed by all of your child's teachers and submitted to Student Reception at least one month prior to departure.

STUDENTS WHO ARE UNWELL AT SCHOOL

The College is only able to provide immediate first aid to students. If your child is unwell, he/she should not be sent to school. The Sick Bay Area provides temporary respite and normally after one period (about 50 minutes), the student needs to return to class, or if still unwell, parents/guardians will be contacted and asked to collect their child. Sometimes this may be inconvenient, but the College is not in a position to provide long-term care for sick students. It is important that you have an alternative contact so that if you are unavailable, another family member or friend can collect and care for your sick child.

With regards to medications, parents are asked to ensure that **prescription medicines** are left at Student Reception for safekeeping. This will enable the First Aid Officer to supervise the administration of the medication. However, for legal reasons, we do insist that students self-administer prescribed medications; alternatively, if parents do not wish for their child to be responsible for taking their medication, they will need to personally attend the school to administer the medication to their child. The only exception to this will be for those students who are in our Education Support Centre, and in this case, a Teacher Assistant will assist the student in taking the medication.

The only medication that the College will provide is paracetamol and only if parental permission has been given via the Health Record Form. A reminder too that if your child has a 'new' medical condition, please ensure you complete a new medical form.

TRANSPERTH SCHOOL BUSES

In meeting with management from Swan Transit, who operate most of our school buses, they wished to point out the following:

- **Interim Student Permits**
These temporary cards do not entitle students to the *Student fare*. This card can be used to obtain a concession fare, which is dependent upon the number of zones travelled.
- **Tagging On**
A number of students are not tagging onto the bus services. Travelling without a valid ticket can result in a fine ranging from \$100 to \$500 and calls into question the honesty of the person evading the fare. It also gives inaccurate data which may result in services being removed or extra buses being deemed not warranted.

ONLINE LITERACY & NUMERACY ASSESSMENT

The first round of the Online Literacy and Numeracy Assessment (OLNA) testing is scheduled for Weeks 6, 7 and 8 of this term. Students in Years 10, 11 and 12 who have not yet demonstrated *Category 3 Standard* for Numeracy, Reading or Writing will have an opportunity to do so at this time. Whilst personalised results have been sent home last year parents may request a copy by emailing danny.battistessa@lasalle.wa.edu.au. Students are encouraged to speak to their English and Mathematics Teachers in order to obtain further assistance.

At the assembly, I called for nominations from students to be on the Year 10 Council.


We have welcomed a number of new Year 10s to the College and in particular I would like to extend an extra special welcome to our exchange student from Germany, Linn Kreimendahl.



BRING YOUR OWN DEVICE PROGRAMME NOW REACHES YEARS 7 – 11

Students in Years 7 – 11 are now part of the Bring Your Own Device (BYOD) programme. This programme has been phased in over the last two years, handing ownership of the student computers back to parents. This has rendered cost savings to the College while ensuring the students have a viable one-to-one computer option.

During the last week of the holidays, Year 7 and 10 students had the opportunity to come and have their devices set up with Office 365 accounts, Office Apps and relevant printer drivers for the College photocopiers. On 23 and 24 January, eighteen (18) sessions took place under the leadership of College staff and student helpers. Many thanks to the following Year 11 students who gave their time to assist parents and students: Csanad Horvath, Soumita Kale, Blake Lamond, Jarrad McNeil, John Clarenze Pangilinan, Chris Poovelil and Ethan Turner.

If any Year 7 or 10 student still does not have Office 365 and printers set up, it is required that they bring their Windows 10 device to either the Network Operations Centre (NOC) or to Mr Vella in the iCentre.

Don't have Windows 10? Attend the NOC and receive an updated email address and password. Using the help-sheet supplied by NOC staff, download and install Windows 10 at home. Then return to the College to have Office 365 set up.
