### YEAR 11 HISTORY EXCURSION – HOLOCAUST INSTITUTE

On Thursday 20 September, our Modern History class departed school to visit the Holocaust Institute of Australia, which is located in Yokine. The excursion provided an opportunity to further our learning in the areas of life in Nazi Germany and the havoc wreaked throughout Europe during World War II, both of which we have closely studied throughout our course. On arrival, we listened to an overview of life in Nazi Germany including living conditions in Jewish ghettos and the history of concentration camps. We then had access to explore the extensive information and photographs displayed. One of the most striking displays was a simple pair of pyjamas. These seemingly inconspicuous articles of clothing had a surprising effect as they allowed us to humanise the people in the photos - something that is necessary in order to comprehend the

horrors of the Holocaust. We then returned to hear a presentation about a Jewish man who survived prison in Soviet Russia, and later returned to Poland after World War II had ended. Our trip to the Holocaust Institute of Australia has reinforced the need to preserve history, and the importance of remembering those who experienced such atrocities.


