I sincerely congratulate Clem on this great effort of capturing the detailed history of our College.

The guests were a combination of former students, former parents, former and current staff, current and past Board Chairs and members. We were very fortunate to have former staff member Br Joe (Emeric) Gabel in attendance, one of only two remaining De La Salle Brothers who worked here at Middle Swan. There were also a number of former principals in attendance – Sr Leo (Kathleen) Dawe rsj (Headmistress of La Salle Girls School 1972 & 1973), Clem Mulcahy (1981 – 1990), Patricia Rodrigues (1992 – 1999), Michael Ciccarelli (2000 – 2003) and Debra Sayce (2011). It really was a great night to catch up and reminisce.

I must thank our Hospitality students who made and served the delicious *hors d'oeuvres*; you truly did a wonderful job. I also thank all of the staff who assisted on the night. Your efforts contributed to the success of this wonderful event. Special thanks are afforded to Sabrina Lynsdale for her overall coordination of the evening.

The 448 page, two-volume historical account of the College since 1954 is on sale from the Accounts Office for \$119. It really is a wonderful account of our College's history!

TRAFFIC ON SCHOOL GROUNDS

The safety of everyone on school grounds is of critical importance, particularly when walking across La Salle Avenue and through the car parks. I remind parents to please obey the speed limit of 10km/hour on the school grounds and be very careful of all pedestrians. It is important too that parents use the drop off and pick up zone correctly. Please do not drop off your child near the Patricia Rodrigues Centre holding up traffic behind you, unless traffic is banked up in front of you. If traffic is flowing you are requested to drive forward as far as possible (even if it is in the marked zone close to the gate and Muriel Street) to drop off or pick up your child, only leaving the area either side of the crosswalk free.

Parents are also asked that when collecting children after hours, such as after band practice or sport, that they park in any car bay available or stick to the traffic drop off and pick up rules as per normal school hours. Please do not park in front of the gym with the entire free pick up zone in front of you as this then banks cars up around the roundabout near the sheds and traffic cannot move. The area around the roundabout is marked 'no parking' to allow people to constantly move through the area. Abiding to these rules will ensure a safe and smooth traffic flow for all.

COLES SPORTS FOR SCHOOLS





Snapchat lured in a whole generation based on snaps 'disappearing' after a short time, so it became a second language for teenagers.

A large percentage of kids say they use Snapchat because their parents do not.

Turning off location services will disable some of the 'cool' photo filters, so kids don't turn off location services. 'Location services' is the ability of your phone GPS to pin-point where a photo was taken, accurate to a few metres. Coordinates show as numbers that, when copied into Google Maps, show a colour image of the place together with directions to travel there.

Enter a school name or a suburb into the search feature on Snapchat and the app will deliver:

- Posts made in proximity to the location
- Other Snapchat account holders' names and searching locations
- Option to add to contacts.

Complete strangers are able to target your child's Snapchat profile, using the school they attend as a way to find them.

Minimise risk:

- Respect the age restrictions of 13+.
- Build trust with your child by explaining why you insist the account be set to private.
- Ensure that Ghost Mode is enabled on the Snap Map, so account information is hidden.
- Turn off location services for the app.
- Regularly review with your child who interacts with their account.
- Ask your child to respect the school's mobile phone policy.

Scenario:

1. Predator types in school name in the Snapchat search feature.
2. Finds regular users of Snapchat at and near school's location.
3. Adds the accounts of any child they find.
4. Follows their snaps.
5. Records or takes screen-shots of them.
6. Sees locations that appear regularly such as home or sports venue.
7. Interacts with the child through their account, and becomes 'friends' with them on other social media.
